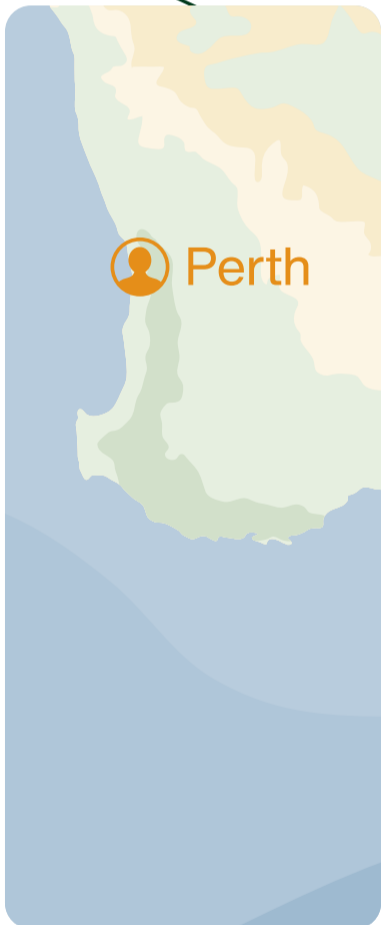

Cargill – Investing in the future of Australian agriculture

Cargill was founded in 1865 and since then grow to have a presence in 70 countries around the world with 155,000 employees. Cargill's presence in Australia commenced in 1967 and has steadily grown with the purchase of our first crush plant in 1983 as well as acquiring AWB and the storage and handling network of GrainFlow in 2011. We are currently one of the largest exporters out grains and oilseeds out of Australia providing market access to Australian farmers through our extensive global network.

We are now looking to the future, and have invested \$100m in upgrading our Footscray and Newcastle crush plants as well as our Narrabri cotton crush facility. This year we announced we have entered into a lease with the Western Australian Government for a potential crush plant in the Kwinana port area.

Sustainability is also important to Cargill's future and we have launched Cargill SustainConnect™, providing incentives for farmers to produce canola with a lower carbon footprint and providing demand customers with new options around sustainable canola and carbon emission reduction strategies.

Cargill is excited about the future of agriculture and partnering to grow with farmers, demand customers, supply chain operators and the food and beverage industry.
