- End to end Supply chain management, including road, rail, Ports, warehousing, oil terminals and ship-loading.



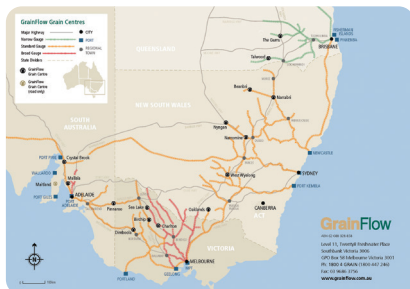

Animal Nutrition & Health (ANH)

Cargill's Animal Nutrition products are imported from our global portfolio and distributed through a local channel partner. This model provides customers with access to leading nutritional products while leveraging established local sales, technical support and distribution capabilities across Australia and New Zealand.

FR3

Cargill's FR3 natural ester dielectric fluid is available in Australia as a sustainable, seed-oil-based insulating fluid for transformers. It delivers superior fire safety (flash point), improved biodegradability, and improved transformer performance compared to traditional mineral oil.

With over 5 million installations globally, FR3 is a proven solution supporting safety, reliability and sustainability.

Sustainability

Our sustainability priorities in Australia focus on climate, land and water and people.

We take a practical approach delivering initiatives that create tangible outcomes for our business customers and communities.

Renewable Energy – Newcastle Crush and Refining Plant

Cargill launched a 2.58 megawatt (MW) solar array at our Newcastle Crush Plant.

Installed onsite, this is the only fully-owned and operated renewable energy asset of its kind by a bulk handler and oilseed processor in Australia.

By integrating renewable energy directly into our operations, we reduce emissions, enhance resilience and create long term value.

Cargill Sustain Connect

Cargill's SustainConnect™ is an innovative program which helps farmers connect with new emerging carbon markets while supporting the transition to a lower carbon agriculture.

We support canola, barley and wheat growers to adopt lower carbon practices through incentives, technical support, data collection and measurement and verification.

This provides farmers with new income opportunities while recognising their role as custodians of the land.

Sustainable Sourced Soy

Cargill supplies soy to the Australian market through our various certified soy programs which are backed by a comprehensive farmer focused sustainability framework.

Cargill has been supplying sustainable soy for more than a decade.

We also offer Smart Solution soya bean meal providing customers with certified, traceable supply from deforestation areas helping meet evolving sourcing policies.

Biofuels

Biofuels are produced from renewable biological materials such as crops, agricultural byproducts, or food waste. They're provide a lower carbon alternative to fossil fuels across the transport sector.

Around 14% of global greenhouse gas emissions come from transport.

Cargill is also adopting renewable fuels within our own fleet, including wind-assisted vessels and biofuel-powered coasters.

In Australia, Cargill is a participant in working with industry and government to support the development of a low carbon liquid fuel sector.

Sustainable Ocean Transport

Cargill invests in lower carbon shipping solutions. The Brave Pioneer, the first of five green methanol dual-fuel dry bulk vessels chartered by Cargill, had its maiden voyage loading Australian sustainable canola at Kwinana Terminal in Western Australia, for refining into biofuels at our plant in Ghent, Belgium.

The vessel can operate on conventional marine fuels and green methanol, delivering up to 70% CO2 emissions reduction compared to traditional fuels.

Community

Through our Cargill Cares program we support a wide range of initiatives that strengthen regional communities.
